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Who we are:

AGIMO [ə'dʒimoʊ] n.

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What we do:

- Work across the Commonwealth Government
- Provide advice, tools, information and services to government agencies.
- Work with governments and other bodies at the local, state, national and international levels.
- Develop whole-of-government policies & strategies:
 - Enterprise Architecture
 - Govt 2.0
 - ICT procurement
 - e-government



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How the Strategy came to be:

- **2006:**
Chief Information Officer Committee (CIOC) requested AGIMO develop a Whole-of-Government IPv6 Transition Strategy.
- **April 2007:**
Established IPv6 Reference Group. The reference group developed the IPv6 Transition Strategy.
- **2007/2008:**
ISPs and Telcos surveyed on their plans for IPv6.
- **December 2007:**
CIOC endorsed Transition Strategy.
- **January 2008:**
Community of Expertise (CoE) established to assist agencies and consider whole-of-government issues.



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What Changed in 2008

- Industry and governmental developments (e.g. OECD meeting in Seoul).
- Strategy revised by CoE.
- Work plan developed.
- Revised Strategy and Work Plan endorsed by CIOC.



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The Revised Strategy

Goal: To ensure Government services remain accessible to all citizens, regardless of what internet protocol they use.

- Maintaining connectivity for and with citizens.
- Maintaining interoperability.
- Maintaining security.
- Leveraging agency ICT refresh cycles.
- Take advantage of industry developments.
- A planned, controlled, and fiscally responsible approach.



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Changes from original Strategy:

- Target dates for completion brought forward from end 2015 to end 2012.
- Work Plan developed to give agencies detailed information on tasks and milestones.
- Quarterly survey of agencies introduced.
- Development of Government Advisory papers covering issues:
 - IPv6 Capability and Compliance
 - IPv6 Security
 - Address Space Acquisition



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Key elements of the revised strategy

- Three Stages:
 - Preparation. end 2009 No Change
 - Transition. end 2011 Brought forward from 2012
 - Implementation. end 2012 Brought forward from 2013-2015
- Timing is now more closely aligned with industry upgrades.
- More practical guidance to agencies
- More practical milestones.
- Quarterly reporting by agencies.
- Consolidated reports.



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Preparation stage (To be completed end 2009)

Major activities/milestones:

- Procurement Policy review;
- Stock take of current ICT infrastructure;
- Stock take of critical applications;
- Training and Training Needs Analysis; and
- Commence progressive installation of IPv6 capable equipment.



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Transition stage (2010 & 2011)

- Major activities/milestones:
 - Continued Upgrade of ICT hardware;
 - Upgrade of critical applications;
 - Upgrade of operating systems;
 - Upgrade of ICT gateways; and
 - Networks certified.



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Implementation stage (2012)

- Major activities/milestones:
 - Finalise whole-of-government implementation approach and schedule;
 - Confirmation of agency readiness;
 - Notification to agencies to enable IPv6-capability; and
 - Report on completion of Strategy



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2009 Progress to date

- Revised Strategy and Work Plan sent to all Government CIOs.
- Revised Strategy sent to industry groups, other governments and internationally.
- Quarterly survey introduced.
- Reports sent to Government on agency progress against milestones.

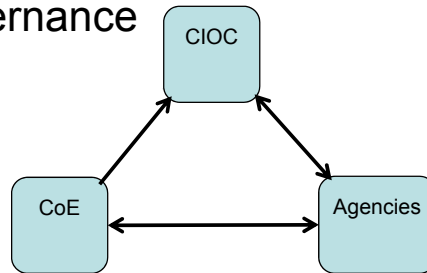


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2009 Surveys

- April 2009. Baseline established.
- July 2009. Monitors progress against milestones.
- October 2009. Progress continues.
- AGIMO working with agencies to maintain momentum.

Governance



- Chief Information Officer Committee responsible.
- Community of Expertise to guide and assist.
- Agencies responsible for implementation locally.
